

MISSION AND DUTIES

The Texas Indigent Defense Commission (TIDC) provides financial and technical support to counties to develop and maintain quality, cost-effective indigent defense systems that meet the needs of local communities and the requirements of the Constitution and state law.


TIDC operates under the direction of a 13-member governing board and is administratively attached to the Office of Court Administration. Texas Government Code 79.037 identifies some of TIDC's key duties:

- Assist counties in improving indigent defense systems;
- Promote county compliance with state indigent defense laws;
- Distribute grants; and
- Monitor each county that receives a grant and enforce compliance with the conditions of the grant.

INDIGENT DEFENSE EXPENDITURES

TOTAL FY 2017 INDIGENT DEFENSE EXPENDITURES \$263 MILLION



In FY 2017, Texas counties reported spending \$263,312,905 on indigent defense, a 7% increase over 2016.

TIDC invested \$38,321,998 in indigent defense provision, offsetting approximately 15% of county costs statewide.

OPERATING BUDGET

This fiscal year, TIDC expended a total of \$40,002,056. Of these funds, \$1,059,632 were for administrative costs—only 2.65 percent of the total amount. These expenses include salaries, operating expenses for 11 full-time staff, and travel for board members and staff as shown in the chart below.



REVENUE SOURCES

TIDC is funded through a combination of appropriations from the GR-Dedicated Fair Defense Account (Fund 5073) and General Revenue. In FY 2017, TIDC had estimated appropriation authority for the balance of the Fair Defense Account, less OCFW expenditures. In addition to these GR-Dedicated funds, TIDC was appropriated \$3.75 million in General Revenue. Funds accrue to the Fair Defense Account from the following sources:

- <u>Consolidated Court Costs</u>: Defendants pay Consolidated Court Costs upon conviction for a range of offenses from fine-only misdemeanors to felonies.
- <u>Juror Pay Court Costs</u>: Defendants pay a \$4 court cost to fund juror pay upon conviction in most offenses. After reimbursing counties for juror pay, remaining funds in excess of \$10 million are transferred to the Fair Defense Account at year's end.
- <u>State Bar Fees</u>: The State Bar of Texas assesses a \$65 fee as part of each attorney's annual bar dues. Half of the proceeds are allocated to the Fair Defense Account.
- <u>Surety Bond Fees</u>: Defendants pay a \$15 fee when posting a surety bond. One-third of the fee goes to the Fair Defense Account.




GRANT DISBURSEMENTS

From FY 2017 funds TIDC invested \$31,751,772 in formula grants and \$6,570,226 in discretionary grants for a total statewide distribution of \$38,321,998.


Formula Grants are calculated based on a combination of population and county indigent defense expenditures. The amount is based on a county's percentage of state population and percentage of state indigent defense expenses multiplied by the Commission's budgeted amount for formula grants.

In FY 2017, all 254 counties qualified and received disbursements totaling \$31,751,772, which represents **83 percent** of total grants disbursed. This amount includes \$1.1 million in supplemental formula grant funding for capital defense disbursed to 14 counties not eligible to participate in the Regional Public Defender Office for Capital Cases: Bexar, Cameron, Collin, Dallas, Denton, El Paso, Fort Bend, Harris, Hidalgo, Montgomery, Nueces, Tarrant, Travis, and Williamson. Sustainabilit (Non-Capital)

Discretionary Grants encourage innovation, sustain quality regional programs, promote compliance with the Fair Defense Act, and help counties facing extraordinary indigent defense challenges. Discretionary grants include five grant types, detailed below.

Competitive Discretionary Grants

TIDC invested \$2,111,632 in FY 2017 Competitive Discretionary Grants, which represents 5.51 percent of total grants disbursed. Competitive Discretionary Grants assist counties in developing new, innovative programs or processes to improve the delivery of indigent defense services.

Sustainability Grants

TIDC invested \$3,540,864 in FY 2017 Sustainability Grants, which represents 9.24 percent of total grants disbursed. Sustainability Grants provide ongoing support for regional public defender programs serving rural counties.

Extraordinary Grants

TIDC invested \$150,000 in FY 2017 Extraordinary Grants, which represents 0.39 percent of total grants disbursed. Extraordinary Grants reimburse a county for extraordinary indigent defense expenses causing a financial hardship.

Technical Support Grant Investments

TIDC invested \$249,662 for FY 2017 Technical Support Grants, which represents 0.65 percent of total grants disbursed. Technical Support Grants assist counties with improving local indigent defense services through projects that build the knowledge base about indigent defense and establish processes that can be replicated by other jurisdictions.

Compliance Assistance Grant Investments

TIDC invested \$518,068 for Compliance Assistance Grants, which represents 1.35 percent of total grants disbursed. Compliance Assistance Grants help counties that have a challenge related to compliance with the Fair Defense Act that may be identified through policy monitoring.
